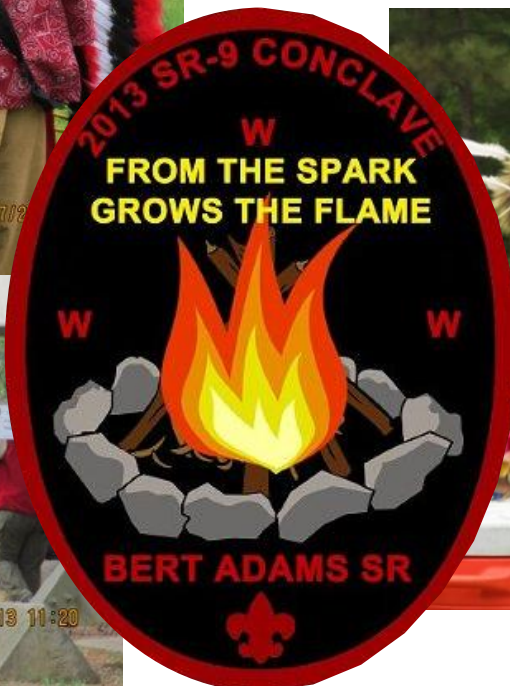
## Spring Ordeal is THIS weekend!

## Brotherhood Membership

Did you know your membership in the OA is not complete until you go through the Brotherhood ceremony? Spring Ordeal is one of the times each year the lodge conducts the Brotherhood ceremony and we would love to see a large number go through it. The requirements for Brotherhood membership are as follows:

1. Learn the signs of Ordeal membership - they are the Obligation of the Order, the Order of the Arrow Official Song, the Admonition, the sign of Ordeal membership, and the Ordeal handclasp.
2. Advance in your understanding of the Ordeal.
3. Serve your unit.
4. Plan for service in your lodge. Be aware that acceptance of Brotherhood membership involves a pledge of service to the lodge. Develop a concrete idea of how you plan to fulfill this pledge.
5. Review your progress. When you feel you have met the four challenges above, write a letter to your Lodge Secretary. In this letter explain what you think the Obligation means, describe how you have been fulfilling this Obligation in your troop and in your daily life, and describe your specific plans for giving service in the lodge program.

Bring this letter that you have written with you. Have your letter typed or in neat, legible handwriting. All letters must be turned in to the Lodge Secretary.

Even if you do not perfectly know the signs of Ordeal membership yet, we still want you to come help at Ordeal and there will be brothers there willing to assist you before the Brotherhood Ceremony Saturday night.

## Vigil Honor Nominations Requested

Vigil Honor nominations are being requested at this time. To be eligible, an Arrowman must have been a Brotherhood member for two years, be registered in Scouting, and be an active (dues paid up) lodge member.

According to the National *Guide for Officers and Advisers*, "The Vigil Honor is a high mark of distinction reserved for those Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position or office to one or more of the following: their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting, or their council Scout camp."

In order to help the nomination committee, anyone wishing to nominate someone is encouraged to do so. Please include Scouting history, OA history and service record, OA office/adviser positions held, camping accomplishments, camp staff experience, and a paragraph about why you think this person is a leader in cheerful service of others, especially in scouting. Answer "How have they distinguished themselves?"

Your nominations are important and will weigh heavily on the deliberations of the committee. 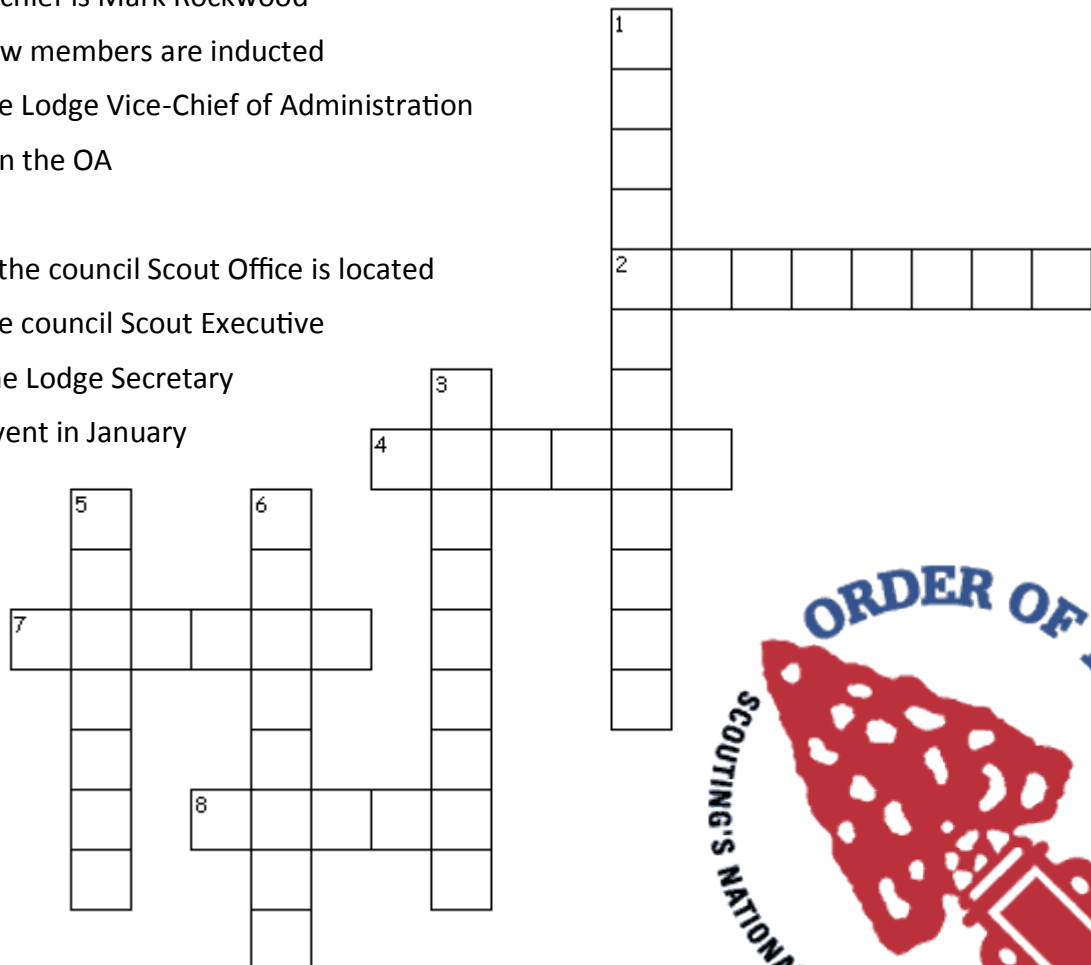

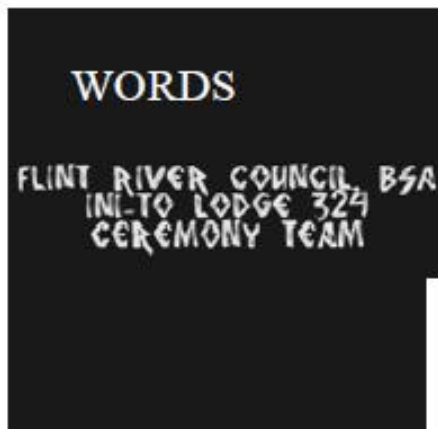
